### **Berkshire Wind Power Cooperative Corporation Awards Scholarships to Mount Greylock Students**

LUDLOW, Mass. – July 18, 2023 – The Berkshire Wind Power Cooperative Corporation (BWPC) has selected two students from the Mount Greylock Regional High School class of 2023 to receive \$1,000 scholarships. The scholarships are awarded to qualifying seniors who are planning to attend either a two- or four-year college or trade school program.

This is the second year of the BWPC scholarship program. The BWPC owns and operates the Berkshire Wind Power Project, a 12 turbine, 19.6-megawatt wind farm located on Brodie Mountain in Hancock and Lanesborough, Mass. The non-profit BWPC consists of 16 municipal utilities located in Ashburnham, Boylston, Chicopee, Groton, Holden, Hull, Ipswich, Marblehead, Paxton, Peabody, Russell, Shrewsbury, Sterling, Templeton, Wakefield, and West Boylston, and their joint action agency, the Massachusetts Municipal Wholesale Electric Company (MMWEC).

This year's scholarship recipients are Grace Lillie of Hancock and Brodi Rosier of Lanesborough.

Lillie will attend Berkshire Community College and major in business. While at Mount Greylock, she participated in the theatre and yearbook clubs and served as a library teacher's assistant. She also studied Honors Biology and Honors Psychology.

Rosier plans to attend Westfield State University. In high school, she played on the volleyball and softball teams. She was also a member of the Leadership Program and a volunteer for the wrestling team.

"We are proud to support the 2023 Berkshire Wind Power Cooperative Corporation scholarship recipients, who have exhibited determination and strength both academically and beyond," said MMWEC Chief Executive Officer Ron DeCurzio.

Since 1998, MMWEC has awarded \$62,000 in scholarships to help students defray the cost of higher education.

MMWEC is a not-for-profit, public corporation and political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts created by an Act of the General Court in 1975 and authorized to issue tax-exempt debt to finance a wide range of energy facilities. MMWEC provides a variety of power supply, financial, risk management and other services to the state's consumer-owned, municipal utilities.
